

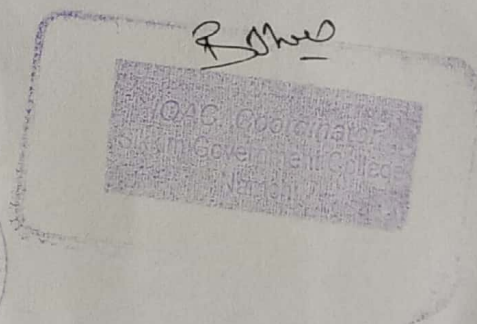
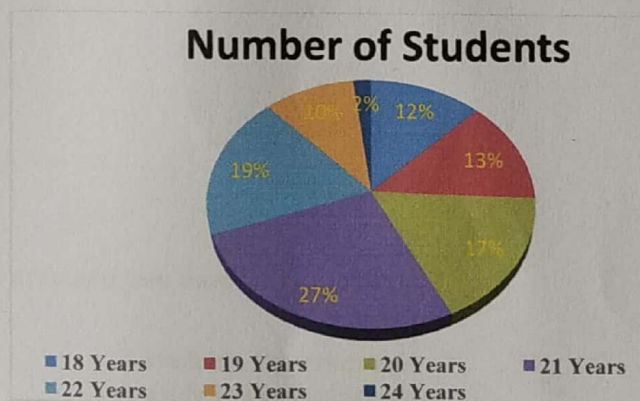
Students Satisfaction Survey (2021-22)

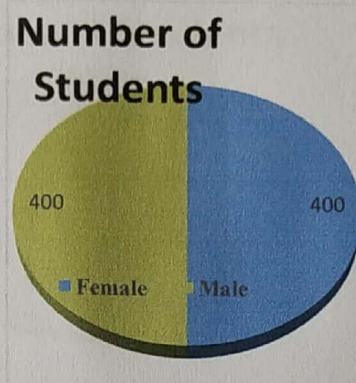

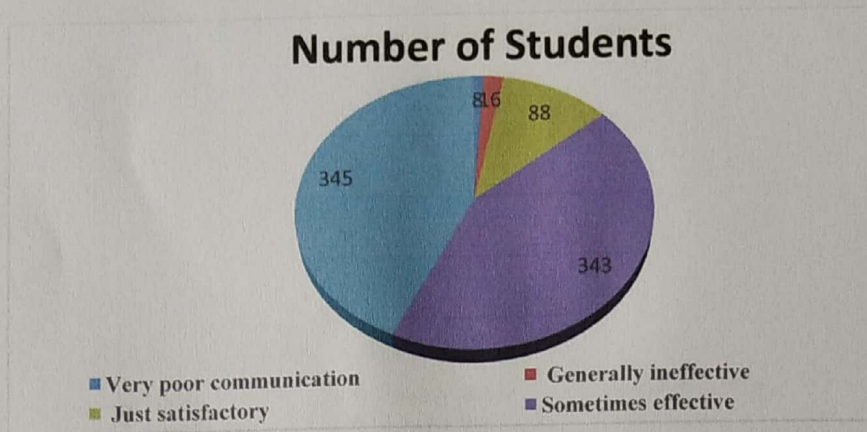
1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?



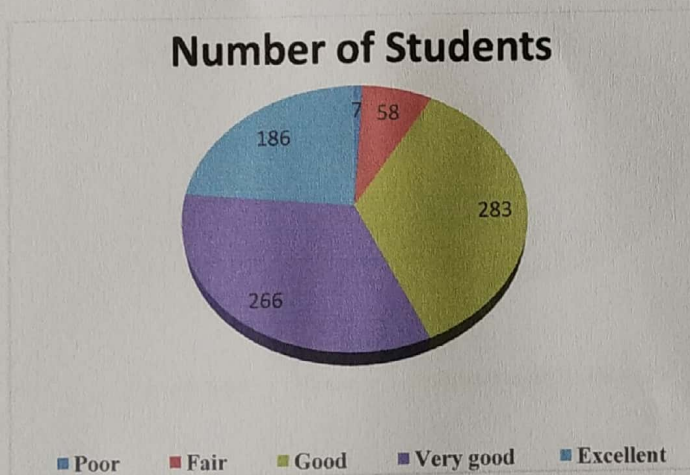
2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?



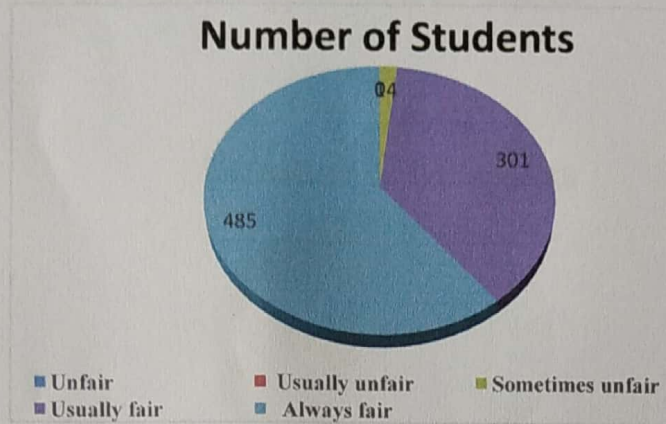
3. How well were the teachers able to communicate in class?



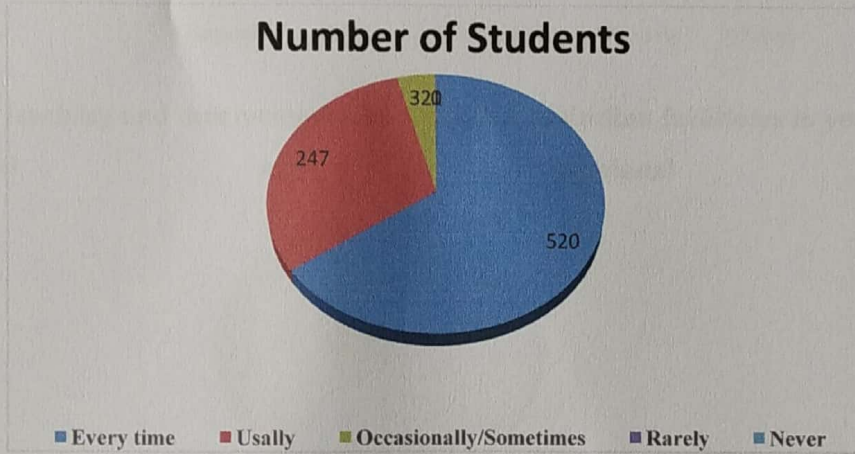
4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as:



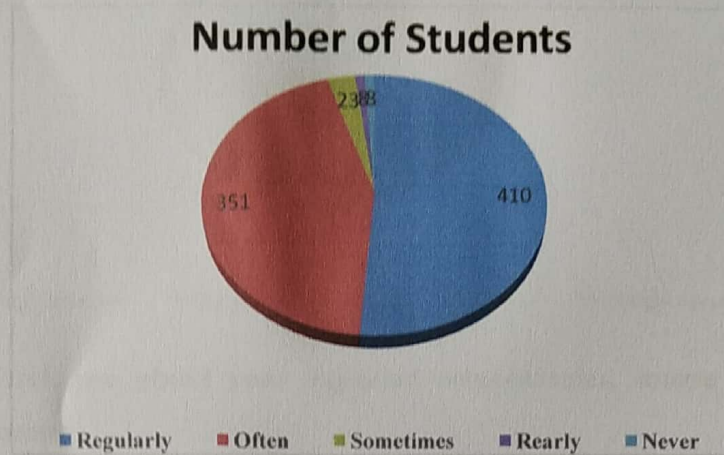
5. Fairness of the internal evaluation (examination) process by the teachers



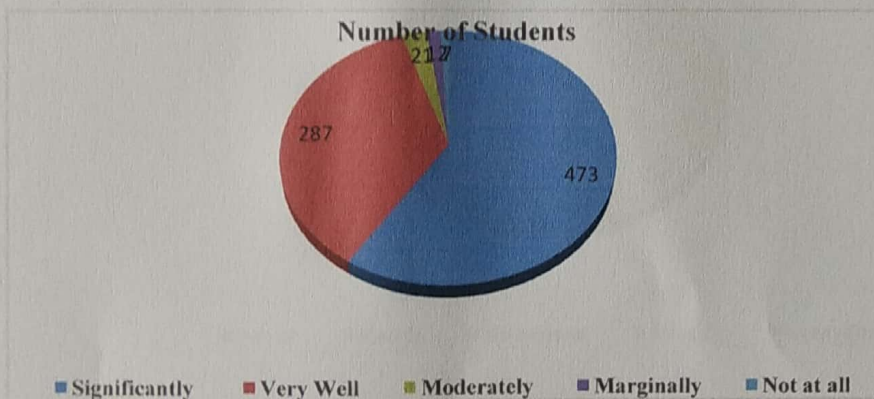
6. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you?



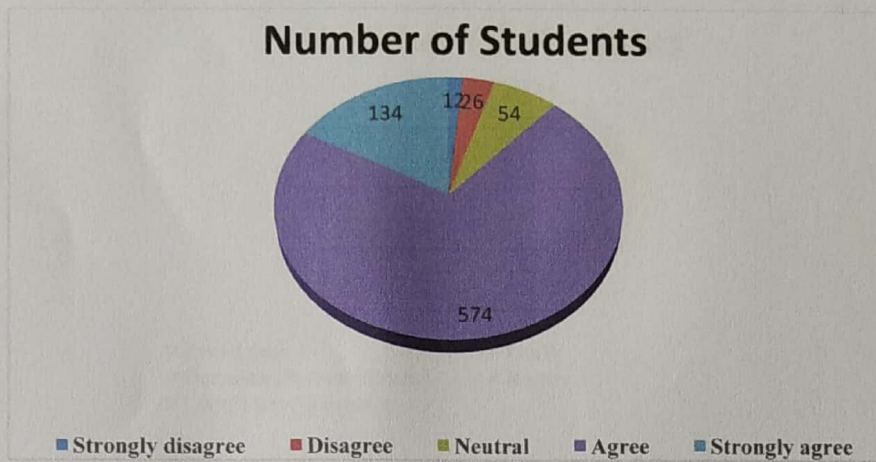
7. The institute (or your department) takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange and field visit opportunities for students.



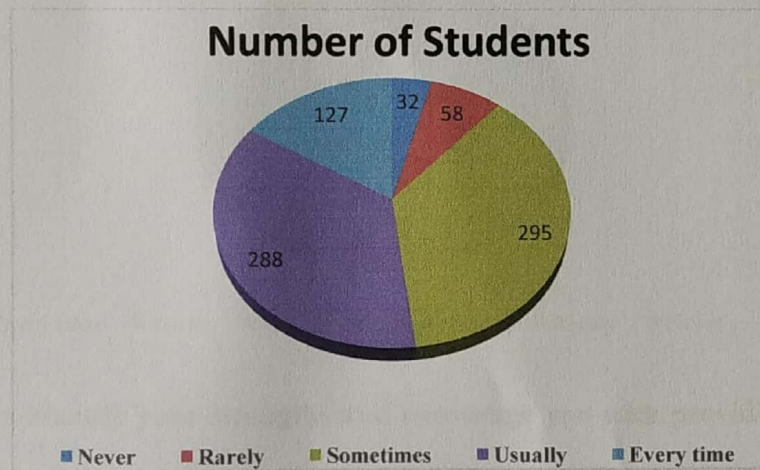
8. The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates in your cognitive, social and emotional growth.



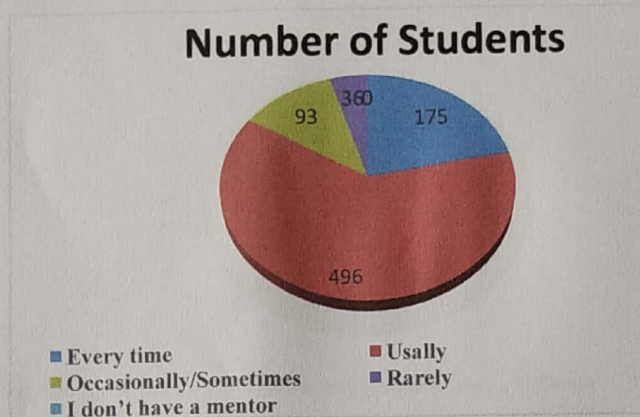

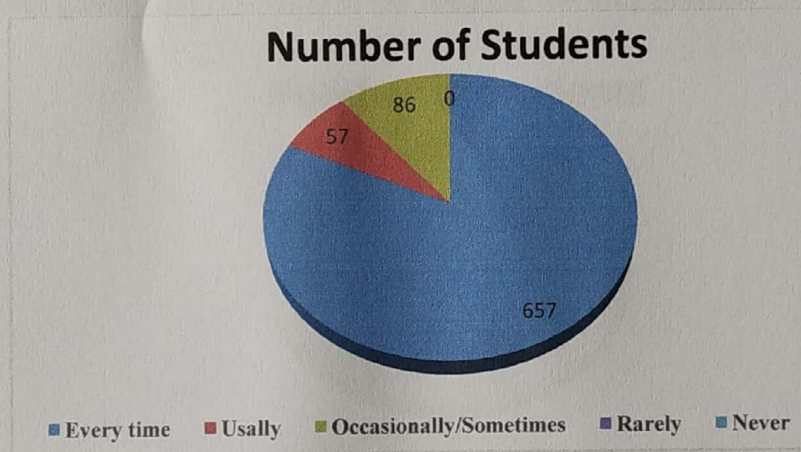
10. Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, course outcomes and program outcomes.



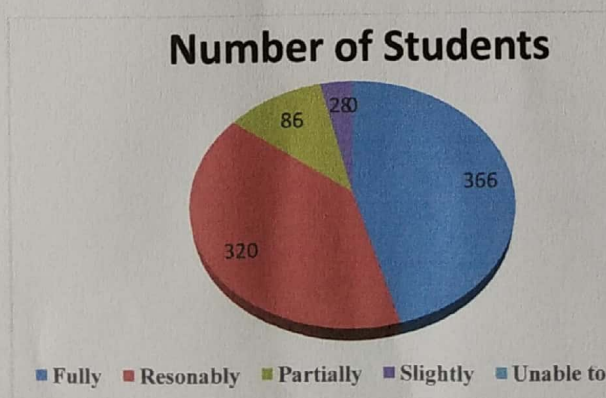

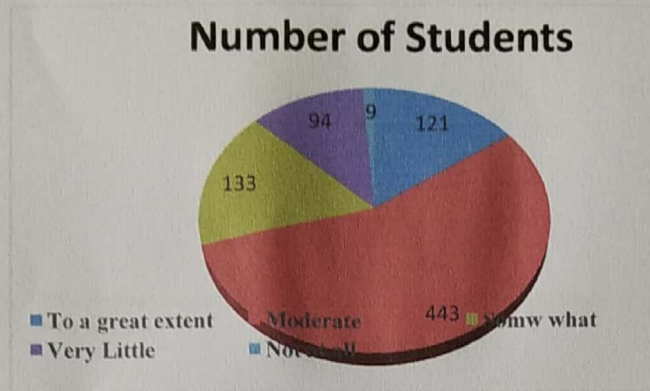
14. Teachers are able to identify your weaknesses and help you to overcome them.



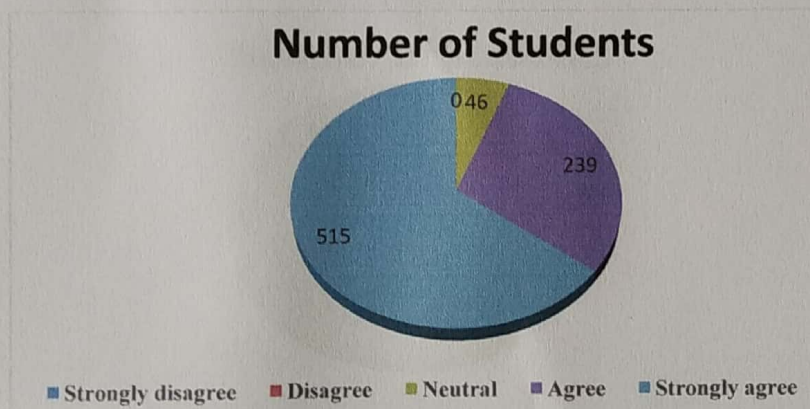
15. The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process.



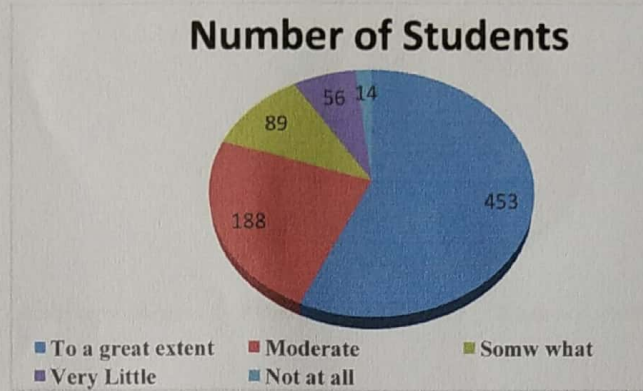
16. The institute uses student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences.



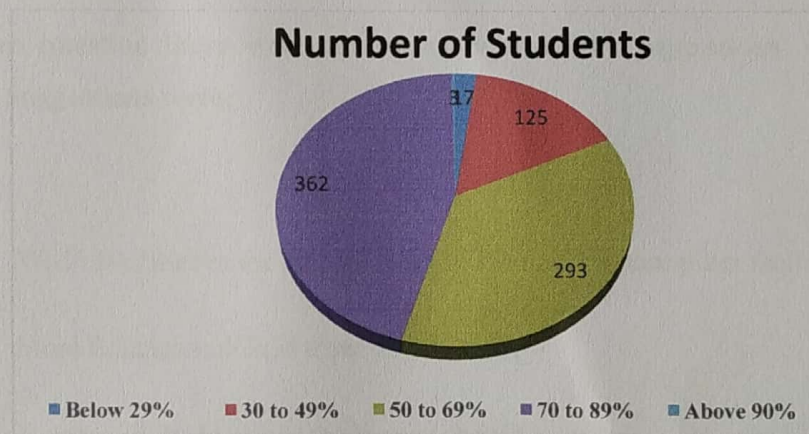
17. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities.



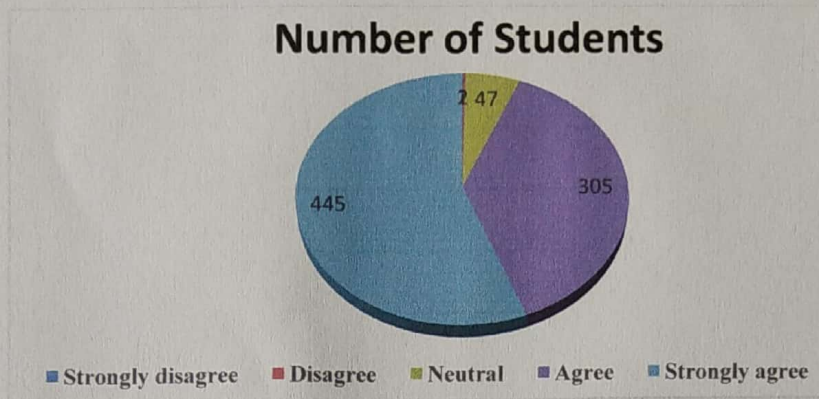
18. Efforts are made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work.
